

Taylor Reimer - BSS Scholarship - \$1,000.

Taylor has been described as a “fantastic young woman, who demonstrates outstanding commitment to community service, leadership, and academic excellence”. A straight A student, Taylor plans to pursue a B.Sc. in Biochemistry leading to a Doctorate in Dental Medicine.

Sydney Holland - KSS Scholarship - \$1,000.

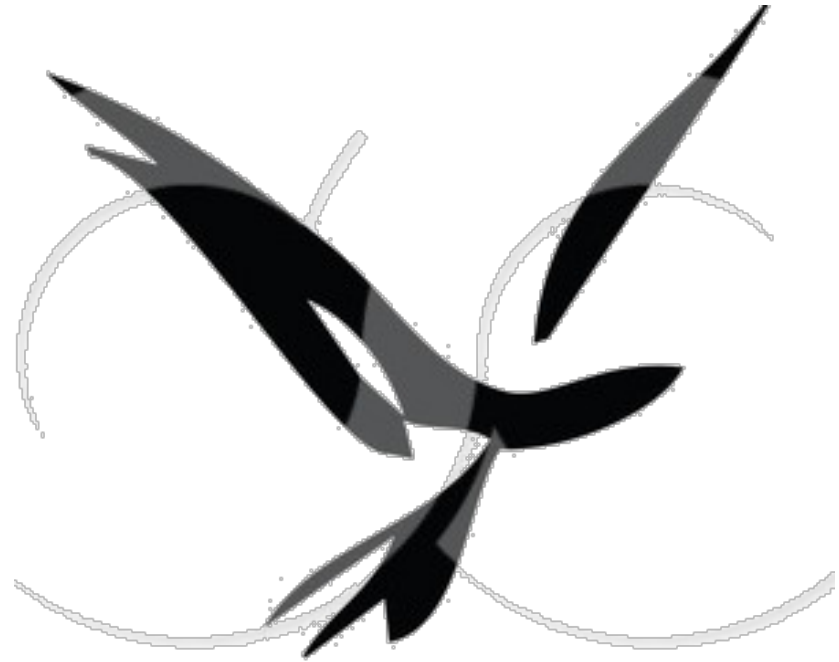
Caley Longmuir - Post-Graduate Scholarship - \$1,750.
