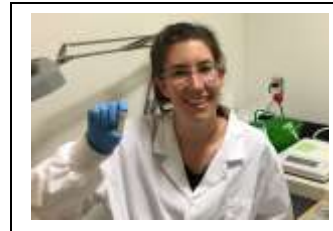


**Anastasia Kosteckyj – Post-Graduate Scholarship - \$2,000**
